All students entering Catherine E. Doyle School (grades K-3) in September 2019 are encouraged to participate in our Summer Reading Program! The objective of this program is to foster the love of reading in all of our young students. This year's theme, **A Universe of Stories**, is centered on the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo 11 landing on the Moon (July 20, 1969). Each grade assignment involves the choice of three books from a supplied list centering on "Space Exploration" as well as a free choice of three books based on the combination of reading and interest levels. Books may be read in hard copy or electronically, and depending on individual reading level, it is expected that some parent/guardians will need to assist our students in the actual reading. The students are encouraged to read books at or slightly above/below their reading levels.

Each student will receive a reading log worksheet that helps to document how many books were read this summer. The goal is for every child to complete the reading assignment log which will be celebrated in a school wide event during the Week of Respect in October of 2019. The completed worksheets should be sent into school with your children by Friday, September 20, 2019. Of course, our students are encouraged to read as many books as they wish throughout the summer months.

The Summer Reading Assignment need not involve the purchase of new books as reading material. The Wood-Ridge Memorial Library is a fantastic resource when looking for reading material, in addition to, the possibility of swapping books with friends/classmates, and the utilization of on-line resources. Our theme is in alignment with the Wood-Ridge Memorial Library's summer theme of "A Universe of Stories" (<https://woodridgememorallibrary.org/a-universe-of-stories-non-fiction/>). Please join the Doyle School Staff in encouraging our young students to "blast off and read" for the challenge, the enjoyment, and the love for reading!
