## **DIRECTIONS FOR ASSIGNMENT 1**

Students are encouraged to read *This I Believe II* by Jay Allison or an interesting text of your choice and complete the assignment that follows. The text should be readily available through most online booksellers. This is an optional summer enrichment assignment that can help transition students into the first marking period.

## **ASSIGNMENT 1**

Write a 4 to 5 paragraph letter to the author of your non-fiction text critiquing the book. Use the following questions as a guide:

- How well were the accounts constructed? Was it chronological? (Explain or support)
- Did the book have a clear focus? Was it entertaining? (Explain, use examples from the text)
- Was this an honest portrayal of the subject? (Explain, why or why not)
- What main points about the subject did you agree (or disagree) with? (Support)

Make sure to use proper letter formatting. This letter must be computer generated. The rubric for the letter component will be distributed in class. Make sure to include the title of your non-fiction book in the opening paragraph.

#### **DIRECTIONS FOR ASSIGNMENT 2**

Students are encouraged to read *The Prince and the Pauper* by Mark Twain or an interesting text of your choice and complete the assignment that follows. The text should be readily available through most online booksellers. This is an optional summer enrichment assignment that can help transition students into the first marking period.

#### **ASSIGNMENT 2**

Create a Slideshow providing detailed information on the topics below. Use specific details from the text wherever possible. Students are encouraged to explore their selected text and think about the following components of literature to help them prepare for the new school year.

- Title, Author, Date of Publication
- Genre and Two Characteristics of the Genre
- Your critique of the book
- Setting (time and place)

- Summary of the plot (should include introduction, rising action, climax, falling action, and conclusion
- Key Quotations (including page number) and why each quote is significant to the character/plot
- List all main characters, their roles in the story, and character traits
- Importance of the Opening and Closing Scenes
- Examples of Literary Devices (such as metaphor, simile, hyperbole, imagery, or symbolism) and How they were used in the story
- Explain the dominant themes of the story
