## NJSLA-S (New Jersey Student Learning Assessment-Science):

- Was a field test for grades 8 and 5 during the spring of 2018. As of this presentation, the NJ DOE has not published tests scores for this assessment.
- High School Biology course did not run last year - no state assessment was administered.

ACCESS FOR ELL's: 21 Students participated in the WIDA ACCESS Assessment. 3 of the 21 Students (14\%) achieved a score of 4.5, demonstrating Proficiency.

DYNAMIC LEARNING MAPS (DLM): 4 Out-of-District participated in a DLM Assessment. With a population size less than 10 students, there is no district DLM report.
